



## Maldives suspends 3 deputy ministers after India strongly raises issue of derogatory remarks against PM Modi

**Divya Delhi:** The Maldivian government reportedly suspended three deputy ministers for derogatory social media posts against Prime Minister Narendra Modi following a backlash with New Delhi strongly raising the matter with Male and the island nation's top opposition leaders slammed the ruling establishment over the row. The three deputy ministers criticised Modi for his post on 'X' following his visit to Lakshadweep, inferring that it was an attempt to project the Union Territory as an alternative tourist destination to the Maldives. Several

Maldivian media outlets, quoting officials, reported that deputy ministers in the youth ministry, Malsha Shareef, Mariyam Shiuna and Abdulla Mahzoom Majid, have been suspended over their posts. The row erupted on a day

the Maldives had strongly raised and expressed concerns about the comments made in regard to the prime minister by certain ministers in the Maldives government with the foreign office today," said a source. The disparaging remarks by the ministers have drawn flak in India, with many celebrities urging people on X to explore domestic tourist destinations instead of going to the Maldives. Several cine stars like Salman Khan and Akshay Kumar and cricket icon Sachin Tendulkar were among the celebrities who appealed to people to visit "Indian islands" and coastal destinations.

President Dr Mohamed Muizzu embarked on a week-long visit to China. In New Delhi, official sources said the Indian High Commission in Male strongly raised the matter with the Maldivian foreign ministry. "Our high commission in

## Modi starts 2024 with big-ticket TN trip, professes 'Tamil love' with eye on LS polls



**Divya Delhi:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi kicked off the year of the 2024 Lok Sabha election with a visit to Tamil Nadu where he sought to emphasise the state's significance for him, and counter the ruling DMK's criticism of the BJP as a party for "Hindi, Hindu and Hindutva". The BJP has been making an aggressive bid to gain a foothold in Tamil Nadu, where power currently alternates between the two prominent Dravidian parties, the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) and the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK), a former BJP ally. On his visit, Modi inaugurated a new terminal building

for the Tiruchirappalli international airport. Altogether, he inaugurated or laid the foundation stone for projects worth Rs 20,000 crore, spanning the sectors of roads, railways, ports, and petroleum. In his address at Tiruchirappalli, also known as Trichy, Modi said Tamil Nadu was home to the ancient language of Tamil and a treasure trove of cultural heritage. "I believe in the continu-

ous expansion of the contribution of Tamil cultural inspiration in the development and heritage of the country," he added, addressing the gathering as "enadhu kudumbam (my family)" after each long pause. On foreign visits, he said, "I cannot stop speaking about Tamil and Tamil culture [whenever an opportunity arises]". The BJP, he added, has been keen on spreading Tamil language and

culture, and noted how the 'sengol (sceptre)', which symbolises good governance and whose concept is rooted in Tamil Nadu, was placed in the new Parliament. Modi also made a mention of the BJP's Kashi Tamil Sangamam and Saurashtra Tamil Sangamam — initiatives that seek to deepen what is described as historical links between the places — saying they had bolstered the enthusiasm for Tamil culture throughout the country. Political analysts said this visit by the PM should be seen as the "official start" of the election campaign in Tamil Nadu. "With the 2024 elections around the corner, today's event will have a two-point approach.

## PM Modi discusses traditional and contemporary security brass problems

The annual security conference in the pink city, which was held behind closed doors, Prime Minister Narendra Modi gave a speech to the nation's top police and intelligence officials. ## Expected February budget for Delhi: emphasis on infrastructure, health, and education

**Divya Delhi:** The budget for Delhi is expected to be over Rs 80,000 crore when it is submitted in February, according to authorities. Special attention will be paid to roads, infrastructure, energy, water, health, education, and additional "gifts" for the populace. Arvind Kejriwal, the chief minister, canceled his planned trip to Gujarat in order to chair the first meeting of ministers to discuss budget preparations. Government representatives said that Kejriwal spoke about the areas that should be given priority in the budget, which should be presented by the middle of "All ministers have been instructed by the CM to expedite budget preparations and establish their priorities. The priorities will be finalized in a meeting of all ministers and officers next week, which will be chaired by the chief minister, according to sources. Following that, recommendations from all parties involved will be considered and included. The citizens of Delhi would also receive numerous significant presents from this budget.

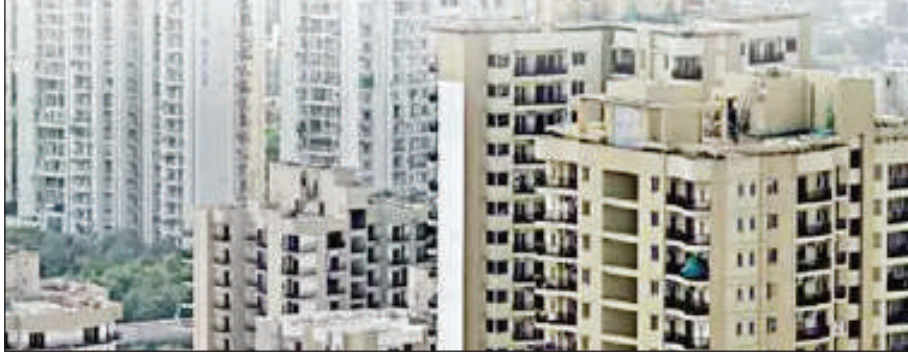

## Noida gives builders a 21% decrease in dues



estate businesses will pay a considerable 21% less than they would have otherwise, thanks to the 24-month Covid zero period (March 2020-22) during which all interest and penalties are eliminated. The conference, the developers of 52 city real estate projects were in attendance, and all eyes were on the updated estimate of dues following the UP government's adoption of

Realtors will be eligible for the second tranche of zero period waiver, which covers 20 months between 2013 and 2015—the year the National Green Tribunal forbade construction within a 10-kilometer radius of the Okhla Bird Sanctuary—if they accept the recalculated dues and accept the state government's rehabilitation proposal, which entails accepting a time-bound payment plan.

## 500 prefabricated toilets to be installed in Ayodhya

**Divya Delhi:** The Uttar Pradesh government has unveiled a plan to boost religious tourism and improve sanitation along the Saryu Ghats in Ayodhya by installing 500 prefabricated toilets along the river bank. The Ayodhya Development Authority (ADA) will oversee the implementation of the prefabricated toilets scheme, covering major ghats, just in time for

the upcoming Makar Sankranti snan (holy dip) event on January 15. The move follows Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's directive to develop Ayodhya as a religious tourism destination.

The selection and operation of the 500 prefabricated toilets will involve an agency selection process, utilizing the quality cost-based selection method.

Control rooms, supported by a 24/7 toll-free helpline, will be established for user support. Access to these toilets will be free for the public for at least 12 months, with the selected agency responsible for maintaining cleanliness, proper functionality, septic waste management, uninterrupted water supply, and the use of eco-friendly cleaning chemicals.

## BJP is opposed to JMM's effort for a bypoll to be held in the Gandey assembly seat



**Divya Delhi:** While the BJP opposed having the bypoll, a delegation of JMM met with the CEO of Jharkhand and requested the EC, through him, to hold the byelection to the Gandey assembly seat in Giridih district as required by the Representation of People's Act of 1951. Following the resignation of its current MLA, Sarfaraz Ahmad, on December 31, the Vidhan Sabha Speaker declared the Gandey seat vacant, citing personal reasons. The JMM delegation, which included two office-bearers and MLAs Dinesh William Marandi, Bhushan Tirkey, and Nalin Soren, stated in their memorandum that the fifth Jharkhand Vidhan Sabha's first session was called to order "According to the Constitution's Section 172, the fifth Vidhan

Sabha's tenure ends on January 5, 2025," the delegation said. The delegation also mentioned that Section 151A of the Representation of People's Act of 1951, which mandates that an election be held in the event that a member voluntarily resigns with more than a year left in office, made holding a byelection for the Gandey assembly seat necessary. On the other hand, in a letter to Governor CP Radhakrishnan, BJP MP Nishikant Dubey requested him to prevent the inauguration of a non-MLA as chief minister. Dubey supported his allegation in his letter by citing two court rulings: the Bombay High Court's W/2019 verdict reversing the EC's decision to hold a byelection to the Katol assembly constituency in Nagpur, Maharashtra.

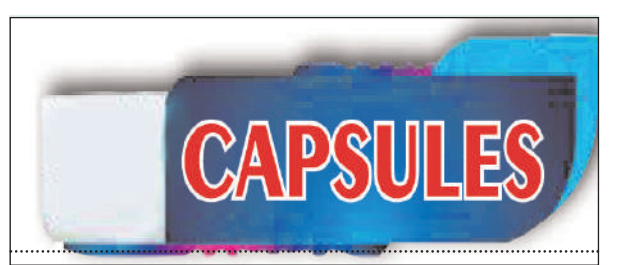

## BJP received Rs 256.25 crore from Prudent Electoral Trust in FY 2022-23

**Divya Delhi:** The BJP received a total of Rs 256.25 crore from Prudent Electoral Trust, while the BRS received Rs 90 crore and the YSRCP Rs 16 crore from the fund during the financial year that ended in March 2023. The trust gave total donations of Rs 363.15 crore to political parties during the year, according to its filing before the Election Commission (EC). The data shared by the trust reveals that while the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) received 70.56 per cent of the donations made by it during the past year, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) received a total of Rs 90 lakh from the fund in two tranches of Rs 45 lakh each. The contributions made by the trust to the BJP were in 17 tranches. The trust made three contributions to the Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS), totalling Rs 90 crore. The maximum contribution of Rs 75 crore was made in one trench to the K Chandrasekhar Rao-led party while another of Rs 10 crore and yet another of Rs 5 crore were given to the ruling party in Telangana. The YSRCP, which is in power in Andhra Pradesh, received contributions to the tune of Rs 16 crore in four tranches, with the maximum being of Rs 12 crore in one go. Another trust -- Paribartan Electoral Trust -- has made a contribution of Rs 75 lakh to the BJP. Electoral trusts, which give donations to political parties, have to make disclosures before the EC during the year in accordance with rules.

## JD(U) & RJD may contest 16 Lok Sabha seats each in Bihar, leave 8 for Congress, Left

**Divya Delhi:** The two major Grand Alliance (GA) partners in Bihar JD(U) and RJD are very close to finalising the number of Lok Sabha seats they will contest along with Congress and the Left parties in the coming elections. The assertion holds credence after Bihar deputy CM Tejashwi Yadav, visited the official residence of CM Nitish Kumar in the afternoon and had one-on-one discussions on the seat-sharing issue. It is believed that Tejashwi carried his father's message to Nitish on the issue. "While seat-sharing has almost been finalised and leaders keep talking over the phone, there are some glitches over a few seats which both RJD and JD(U) want to contest. This issue will also be sorted soon," said a senior RJD leader. He said as per a



rough formula, RJD and JD(U) will contest 16 seats each while Congress will be given five seats and the Left three. One plus or minus is negotiable, he added. There are 40 Lok Sabha seats in Bihar. "Nitish is adamant on 17 seats as his JD(U) had contested

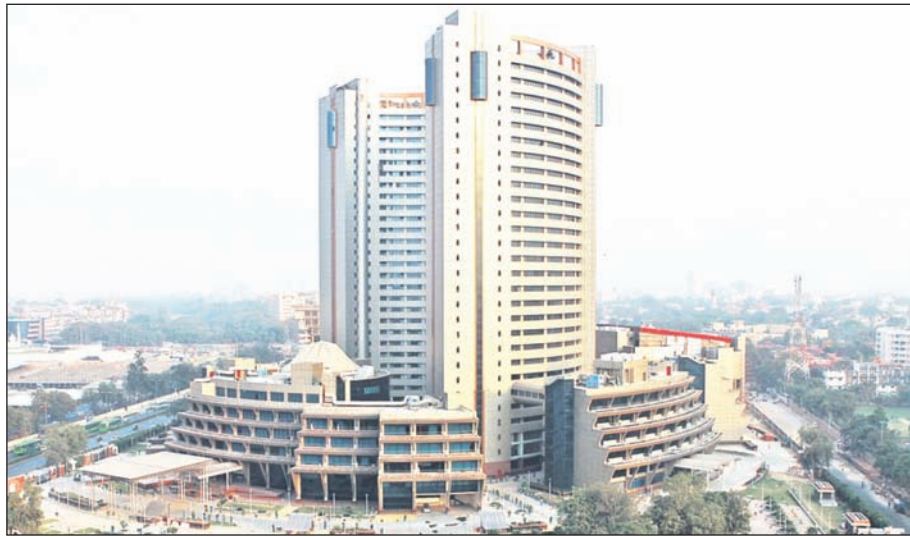
the same number of seats in the 2019 LS elections and won 16 in partnership with BJP. If RJD and JD(U) fight 17 seats each, the Left may have to compromise and will be given one seat only," said a Grand Alliance.

## Haryana state federation calls for two separate trials for National Championships

**Divya Delhi:** Wrestlers in Haryana are in a difficult position with the state federation announcing two separate trials to pick the team for the Senior National Championships. The development comes in the wake of the IOA ad-hoc panel announcing the National Championships in Jaipur from Feb 2-5, and the suspended Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) calling the move 'illegal' while planning to hold a separate National Championships. The tussle for the administrative control of wrestling in the state federations has intensified and the wrestlers are feeling the heat. Haryana Amateur Wrestling Association (HAWA) president Rohtash Singh has announced state trials from Jan 17-18 in Sonapat, while HAWA general secretary issued a separate circular calling the state trials to be conducted in Hisar on January 13 and 14. Rohtash, who earlier backed the former WFI president Brij Bhushan Singh's faction, changed sides before the WFI election in support of the group backed by the protesting wrestlers and contested for the post of joint secretary and lost. Rakesh Singh, on the other hand, has the backing of the newly-elected WFI.

# MCD hikes property rent in 79 markets by up to 10 times

**Divya Delhi:** Municipal Corporation of Delhi has issued a public notice announcing its decision to increase the ground rent of properties transferred from the land & development office (L&DO) in 79 markets.

"The corporation approved a resolution in November regarding the revision of ground rent in respect of the properties transferred from L&DO. The enhancement of the ground rent may be followed on the similar lines as adopted by L&DO," stated the pub-

lic notice issued by the administrative officer, land and estate department "For properties where 0-10 years have elapsed since revision has fallen due, a four times increase in ground rent will happen For those proper-

ties where no increase has happened in 11-20 years, the rise will be six times, for 21-30 years, it will be eight times and for properties where no revision of rates has happened in 31-40 years, the increase will be 10

# 32% of DPCC posts vacant, 50% staff on contract



**Divya Delhi:** About 32% of posts at Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) are vacant. Those occupied have nearly 50% contractual staff. These details were shared by the agency in response to an RTI query filed by an environmental activist. DPCC, which implements pollution-related norms, has 344 approved posts, of which 234 are filled. Of these, 111 are regular employees and 122 contractual. The agency has no data on total staff recruited since 2014, revealed the RTI query.

Over whether any letter was sent to Delhi government to increase the staff of DPCC or to fill up the vacancies, DPCC replied that the "matter is under process" for Group A employees. For the Group B employees, the letter has been sent to Delhi

Subordinate Services Selection Board. A residents' forum named URJA had shared a report stating that the agency was virtually absent in one of the hotspots of Delhi for implementation of the summer action plan despite several anomalies on the ground. According to the report, in Wazirpur, a large number of people did not see anti-smog guns in their area, many large construction sites did not display the registration certificate in public domain and no teams were seen monitoring open burning. "Delhi has been suffering from pollution for the last so many years, but surprisingly, no concrete efforts are being taken to control the same. DPCC has been facing a staff crunch for a long time now and it is impacting pollution control measures across the city," claimed Amit Gupta, who filed the RTI query. Officials of DPCC did not respond despite several attempts.

# Blood not for sale, charge processing cost only, DCGI tells blood banks

**Divya Delhi:** The Drugs Controller General of India banned all charges on blood units, except supply and processing costs. DCGI has sent out a letter stating this to drug controller cum licensing authorities in all states and Union territories. Referring to the meeting of Drugs Consultative Committee held in September last year, DCGI wrote, "It was recommended with respect of agenda No. 18 of ATR point 3, for overcharging of blood, it was opined that blood is not for sale, it is only for supply and only pro-



cessing cost may be charged by a blood centre. "DCGI has also asked the drug controller cum licensing authorities to direct all blood centres to adhere to the revised guidelines for recovery of processing charges. When a person donates blood, it is not transfused into a patient directly. The donated blood, referred to as whole blood, is processed in centrifuges

to separate it into transfusable components. This includes red cells, platelets and plasma. The exercise is referred to as blood processing and a cost is incurred on this. Centre released a guideline in 2022 stating that private blood banks cannot charge more than Rs 1,550 for processing whole blood. Processing charges for packed red cells, fresh frozen plasma, and platelet concentrate all of which are required for transfusion in patients have been capped at Rs 1,550, Rs 400, Rs 400 respectively for private labs.

# AAP renominates Sanjay and selects Maliwal for the Rajya Sabha



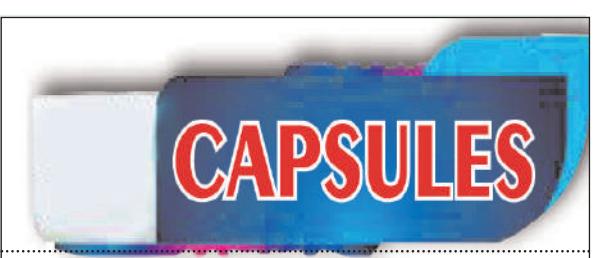
**Divya Delhi:** The party's political affairs committee, led by Chief Minister of Delhi Arvind Kejriwal, announced the nominees. The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) renominated sitting lawmakers Sanjay Singh and ND Gupta for second terms in the Upper House and nominated Swati Maliwal, the head of the Delhi Commission for Women (DCW), to the Rajya Sabha. Because of his alleged involvement in corruption related to the Delhi excise policy 2021-2022, Singh is incarcerated. The party claims the matter, which is being looked into by the Enforcement Directorate and the Central Bureau of Investigation, is the

result of a "political vendetta," and he has refuted all of the allegations. The party's political affairs committee, led by national convener of the AAP Arvind Kejriwal, the chief minister of Delhi, announced the nominees for the Upper House. For the first time, DCW Chairperson Swati Maliwal has received a nomination.

In a statement, the party said, "The PAC has decided to support Sanjay Singh and ND Gupta for their respective second terms as Rajya Sabha members." But Sushil Kumar Gupta, the AAP's Haryana state president and current Rajya Sabha MP, has been removed.

# MCD finalising road network plans for three illegal colonies

**Divya Delhi:** The MCD town planning department has published the map plans proposing road widening in these colonies for seeking public feedback. The Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) is in the process of finalising the road network plans for three unauthorised colonies in the Capital. These road network plans will be the first step in regularising the approximately 1,800 unauthorised colonies in Delhi. A senior municipal official said that draft plans for the regularisation of the three colonies — Khirki Extension in south Delhi, East Azad Nagar in east Delhi, and Saroop Nagar Extension in north Delhi — have been prepared with the help of School of Planning and Architecture. The plan broadly proposes a road widening exercise in these colonies under three categories of road — 6m, 9m, and 12m.

**Divya Delhi:** Passengers may now buy tickets for DTC and Delhi Metro buses using the same app. The Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) has connected the One Delhi mobile app of the Delhi government with its ticketing systems. Anuj Dayal, principal executive director, corporate communications, DMRC, stated that "the integration of issuing QR tickets for Metro and DTC buses through One Delhi app will add one more channel for issuing Delhi Metro tickets and will facilitate commuters to use one single app for booking both metro and bus tickets." He continued by saying that this strategic alliance will provide travelers with a one-stop shop for all of their transit needs, making riding the Delhi Metro even more convenient. The software provides integrated bus and metro route planning in addition to ticketing. "The One Delhi smartphone app will create a detailed itinerary that smoothly integrates both forms of transportation based on your chosen starting point and destination. According to a DMRC spokesman, "This feature eliminates the need to switch between multiple apps or consult different sources for bus and metro schedules." The official went on to say that the integration of DMRC's ticketing services into the app is a big step forward in the city's development of a more integrated and effective urban transportation system.

# RWA scheme for tax rebate to kick off

**Divya Delhi:** Aimed at benefiting all registered RWAs and group housing societies, MCD is set to launch a redesigned Sahbhagita Scheme. The registration process for the scheme will continue until March 31. The benefits of the scheme include the allocation of 10% of the total property tax collected from an area towards incentive to RWAs or group housing societies, provided at least 90% of the residents are property tax compliant. Further, an additional 5% of the total property tax collected will be allocated towards wet waste disposal incentive if the residents contribute to 100% waste segregation at source, 100% composting, recycling of dry waste, and handling over the remaining dry waste to authorised agencies, said an official.

# LG directs DMs to spend a night at Delhi's villages

**Divya Delhi:** The LG's orders came after he held consultations with over 500 villagers from 180 Delhi villages at Raj Niwas to discuss the problems that they face. Lieutenant governor (LG) VK Saxena directed all district magistrates in Delhi to spend the night at villages in the Capital to get a first-hand account of the problems faced



by the residents there. Saxena said his directions are in line with

# Women government employees can now nominate children over spouse for pension

**Divya Delhi:** The Union government has now amended the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules of 2021, in order to allow women government servants and pensioners to nominate their children for receiving family pension over their spouse, if at the time of their death, any proceedings for divorce, domestic violence, or dowry demands happen to be pending against the said spouse. Till now, the rules provided for the family pension to first go to the surviving spouse and the children became



eligible to receive it only after the death of the spouse. As a result, several women officials and pensioners were asking if it was possible to nominate children before the spouse in cases where divorce proceedings are underway or domestic violence cases are pending against the spouse.

# A unique exhibition of sarees from all around the nation is taking place alongside the R-Day parade

## 2024: Global Election Fest

**Divya Delhi.** 2024 will be a historic election year, when democracy will undergo a major test with elections in approximately 70 countries including the United States, India, Mexico and South Africa. More than 3.7 billion voters will head to the polls, and their results may have global impact and ramifications. The current year will be the greatest year for democracy and democratic institutions worldwide. The greatest power in the world (the United States), the most-populous country (India), the biggest trading bloc (the European Union), the largest Muslim country (Indonesia), the largest Spanish-speaking country (Mexico) and the territory that is the most contentious one between the two superpowers of this century (Taiwan), all will hold elections in 2024. A total of more than 3.7 billion inhabitants around 70 countries – or almost half of the global population – will head to cast their votes in either presidential or legislative elections in the coming year. The verdict of these polls may have profound consequences on the lives of people and on a world that is going through a turbulent time, with on-going brutal wars in Ukraine and Gaza, as the West seems falling into decline, with no clear alternative. On a geopolitical level, this electoral jamboree might have a major impact. Major disruptive results include the return of Donald Trump to the White House, a third consecutive victory in Taiwan by candidates that Beijing considers hostile, or a consolidation of the extreme right in the European Union, all of which could lead to far-reaching consequences. In addition to these, other elections to watch out for include the potential presidential elections in Venezuela to those in Ukraine, from Indonesia to South Africa and Mexico, besides the United Kingdom – where a substantial change of course would not be expected regardless of the outcome. However, what might be the worrisome aspect of these elections is the litmus test which democracy will undergo. Surveys by different international think tanks and institutes indicate dissatisfaction with the present-day working of democratic institutions – a sentiment common throughout the nations of the west – meaning, the US and Europe – even though they see themselves as democracy's home ground. A recent Ipsos opinion poll in western countries found a widespread belief that current democratic systems favour the rich and powerful and ignore everyone else. Freedom House, the independent, US-based watchdog concluded in its 2023 report that the Global Freedom Index declined for the 17th consecutive year. The principle of free speech, essential to a fully functioning democracy, is also under attack. Paradoxically, this unprecedented vote-fest comes at a moment when classic forms of liberal democracy are under existential attack from authoritarians and dictators such as China's Xi Jinping and Russia's Vladimir Putin, far-right nationalist-populist parties such as in Austria, Hungary and Scandinavia, and military coup plotters and Islamists from Venezuela to Chad. Yet the report said while 35 countries experienced declines in political rights and civil liberties, 34 saw overall gains. Autocrats were neither infallible nor unbeatable. The geopolitical and economic impacts of so many ballot box battles, occurring more or less at once, may combine to further destabilise an unstable world – for good or bad. The European continent will see elections in Austria, Belgium, Croatia and Finland, as well as for the European Parliament in June.

## Modi's return to office in 2019 was one of the biggest pro-incumbency

**The countdown** for elections to the 18th Lok Sabha has started, and all estimates suggest Narendra Modi will return to 7, Lok Kalyan Marg with an absolute majority. While the Opposition parties are trying to put up a united front to stop Modi, the attempts to unite are limited to parties meeting at various locations in the country and dispersing without arriving at any concrete agenda. Opposition disunity apart, there are several factors that make Narendra Modi's re-election as Prime Minister imminent.

## Charisma intact

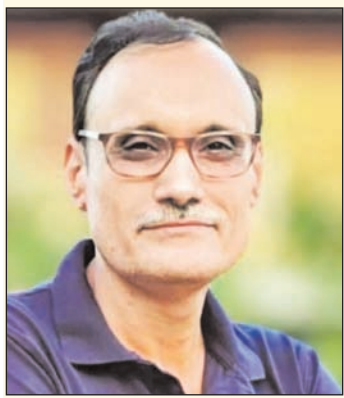
In the post-Independence electoral history of India, there has been no mass leader whose popularity has soared consistently like that of Narendra Modi. Today, no other leader can match up to Modi's 'image' and 'leadership'. 'Brand Modi' evokes a trust among people that the country has not seen in the past, or the present. The absence of any other credible face is a major reason why BJP's return to power is assured. What constitutes the BJP's biggest strength is the opposition's biggest

weakness. There is no face in the parties trying to take on the BJP that garners the kind of confidence Modi instils in the people. The fact alone sets the BJP ahead in the race against the rest. Because of Modi's leadership and his charisma, a large section of the country joined the BJP after 2014. This was the reason that in the 2019 general elections, the BJP achieved its best vote percentage.

The result was a big stamp of approval of the people on Prime Minister Modi because the party had con-

tested the election in his name, taking to voters the development work initiated under him. While other governments have suffered anti-incumbency, Modi's return to office in 2019 was one of the biggest pro-incumbency mandates in the country's history. While the Congress has returned to power in the past, it has either been in the initial years of Independence when no opposition to Congress existed, or due to a sympathy wave as in the case of the 1984 victory in the aftermath of Indira Gandhi's assassination.

## Farmers will receive a fair price when cooperative sugar mills are revived

It appears that long-standing problems with sugar mill income taxes are beginning to be resolved. In fact, payments made to sugarcane farmers by cooperative sugar mills prior to the assessment year 2016-17 will be allowed to be claimed as expenditures, thanks to the Union Budget 2023-2024 and the efforts of Cooperation Minister Amit Shah and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who are working to resolve income tax-related issues that have been hanging over for decades. In section 155 of the Income-tax Act, a new sub-section 19 (1) has been added in response to this. In July 2023, CBDT released Standard Operating Procedures related to this as well. The National Federation of Cooperative Sugar Factories Limited study states that cooperative sugar mills

have benefited by Rs 46,524 crore as a result, resolving long-standing income tax difficulties. The state's farmers will benefit from this. Additionally, the government has decided that cooperative sugar mills will not be required to pay extra income taxes when they give farmers greater payments for their sugarcane, up to the State Advised Price or a fair and remunerative price. With the help of this provision, cooperative sugar mills will be able to offer their members a greater price for sugarcane and will be exempt from income tax on the cost of paying this higher price. According to the explanation released in October 2021, this clause has been in effect since April 2016 and has been providing member farmers with benefits through cooperative sugar mills.

The government's decision will also compel the commercial sugar mills to pay the farmers a reasonable price. As a result, the government is taking sugarcane growers' interests into consideration when making this decision. 10, 000 crore through NCDC to improve Cooperative Sugar Mills A new initiative called 'Grant-in-Aid to NCDC for Strengthening of Cooperative Sugar Mills'

has been introduced by the Ministry of Cooperation. The Government of India is contributing a grant of Rs. With this award, NCDC will be able to lend cooperative sugar mills up to ten thousand crore rupees. The cooperative sugar mills will have the option of using for working capital, ethanol plant establishment, cogeneration plant establishment, or all three tasks. The NCDC has sanctioned more than Rs. 3010.57 crore for 24 cooperative sugar mills thus far. Additionally, when it comes to purchasing ethanol and establishing CROGEN power plants, the Central Government is favoring cooperative sugar mills. It appears that the Petroleum Ministry will put cooperative Choni mills on par with commercial companies for ethanol purchase under the ethanol blading program. Additionally, work is being done to create Kojan power stations powered by bagasse from sugarcane. These actions will boost cooperative sugar mills' revenue and company operations. The GST rate on molasses has been lowered from 28% to 5% in order to support cooperative sugar mills. By October 2023, the government plans to lower the 28 percent GST currently applied to sugarcane to just 5%. Distilleries will

have more liquidity as a result. Since their primary source of raw materials is molasses. The decreased GST will mean that they need less working capital. Higher margin distilleries are being developed by cooperative sugar mills without ethanol or distillery operations. You can sell it to make extra money. As a result, the RBI made a number of significant decisions to alleviate the challenges that cooperative banks were facing in conducting business. The Prime Minister and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah led the central government's attempt to address these issues.

Now, in order to grow their company, urban cooperative banks are allowed to create new branches. Like commercial banks, cooperative banks will likewise be allowed to pay off debts in full. Urban cooperative banks have been given additional deadlines to meet the targets for priority sector lending (PSL). To facilitate regular communication between RBI and Urban Co-operative Banks, a nodal officer has been designated. The cooperative banks now have the authority to relocate their offices or build additional branches and ATMs while they are at home.

Customers of urban cooperative banks are now able to access financial services. For both rural and urban cooperative banks, the maximum amount for personal house loans has been raised by more than twice. With the new criteria, rural cooperative banks can now diversify their business by lending to the residential housing and commercial real estate industries. As of now, cooperative banks are CGTMSE Member Lending Institutions (MLIs). As a result, the member cooperative banks can now receive risk coverage for loans of up to 85%. Additionally, cooperative banks will now offer loans to businesses in the cooperative sector without the need for collateral.

In actuality, the RBI approved on April 5, 2023. By tying the license fee to the volume of transactions, the circular has lowered the cost of onboarding on cooperative banks' contemporary Aadhaar Enabled Payment System (AePS). In addition, the facility will be provided without charge to cooperative financial institutions for the first three months of the pre-production phase. Farmers will soon be able to bank on their figure print from the comfort of their own homes thanks to this.

## Bangladesh elections have pitted the West against Sheikh Hasina, But she has Modi's support

**The Bangladesh elections** seem to be virtually a done deal, with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina likely to be re-elected for a fourth straight term when the polls are held on 7 January – although this will be her fifth term as PM, having been elected once before in 1996. The question, then, is not whether Hasina will be PM but what kind of PM she will be. What should Bangladesh, its neighbourhood and, indeed, the world, expect from her rule over the next five years? At least the Western world is already positioning itself – mostly against her. On the other end of the spectrum lies Russia – as if to underline the fact that international diplomacy has

been split wide open, at least since the Ukraine war – which has openly criticised the West for instigating an "Arab Spring" in Bangladesh. Meaning, according to Moscow, on the pretext of suing for democracy, Western nations are trying to unseat an elected government. Some of the charges are startling. It seems that a diplomat in the US mission in Dhaka, Matthew Bay, met Jamaat-e-Islami leader Syed Abdullah Muhammad Taher on the US embassy premises, to discuss the political situation in Bangladesh just a couple of months before the polls.

You could argue that the Americans – or at least, the Democrat

Party – seem particularly oblivious to the lessons of history. Back in 1971, the US sided with Pakistan against the creation of Bangladesh because Pakistan was giving the Americans access to the Chinese leadership, in the hope that Beijing would neutralise the powerful Soviets – and willfully ignored the fact that the Jamaat had sided with the Pakistan Army and against its own people.

It collaborated in the assassination of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in 1975, allied with General Ziaur Rahman's Bangladesh Nationalist Party and has since openly colluded with organisations that openly target Hasina.

## Attack on democracy !

## Darjeeling tea production falls 9% in 2023 to lowest level in 6 years



**Delhi:** Darjeeling tea production in 2023 is estimated to be the lowest in over 50 years, with an expected decline to 6.1-6.3 million kg. This is a decrease of at least 9% compared to the previous year. The decline in production is attributed to factors such as the closure of 10 gardens in Darjeeling and a shortage of workers affecting tea plucking. Industry players also noted a decline in average price realisation during auctions, although this may not accurately reflect producers' earnings. "Generally, December is a lean month for tea

production. In 2022, it was only 60,000 kg in December. The December 2023 figures are yet to come but it will not make much difference," CTTA secretary general Kalyan Sundaram said.

The output in 2023 is expected to be the lowest since 3.2 million kg in 2017. "But 2017 was not a normal year. There was a strike that affected production," said Sandip Mukherjee, adviser, Darjeeling Tea Association. What has come as a further blow is a decline in average price realisation during auctions. Compared to 2022, prices fell 7.6% to Rs 315 a kg the lowest since 2015, when it was Rs 290 a kg. Industry players, however, said the average realisation may not be the best indicator of how much producers are earning.

## Fintech company MobiKwik intends to raise 700 crore and has refiled its IPO papers with SEBI

**Delhi:** One MobiKwik Systems Ltd., a unicorn fintech company, has once again filed documents for an initial share sale in an attempt to collect up to 700 crore, just over two years after shelving its IPO proposal. But compared to the 1,900 crore it had suggested when it filed the draft documents the amount to be generated through the Initial Public Offering (IPO) is significantly less. Peak XV Partners-backed One MobiKwik Systems Ltd. is now attempting to raise 700 crore through a new share offering, as per the Draft Red Herring



Prospectus (DRHP) submitted A pre-IPO placement of up to 140 crore worth of the company's securities may be contemplated. Should such a placement be made, the next issue's size will be diminished. According to the draft papers, 250 crore of the proceeds from the new offer will go toward financing expansion in

the financial services industry, while 135 crore will support the payment services sector. In addition, 135 crore will be allocated for investments in data, product and technology, machine learning and artificial intelligence, and 70.28 crore would be used for capital expenditures related to the payment devices business and general corporate reasons. Through the book-building process, the offer is being made, with at least 75% of the issue being available for distribution to eligible institutional buyers.

## Ola Electric wins 40% share in Dec

**Delhi:** Ola Electric stormed past the 40% market share milestone in electric two-wheeler sales in December, driven by deep discounts and an extensive offering of aggressively priced e-scooters at multiple price points. The company offered discounts nearing 18% or 20,000



on the S1 X+ electric scooter, its cheapest offering in the market, as it moved to grab a larger share of the e-two-wheeler market

ahead of a potential public listing early this year. While there were negligible discounts on the TVS iQube and Bajaj Chetak after the festive season, Hero's Vida V1 and Ather's 450 range of scooters had cash discounts of just 26,500, according to a report by Motilal Oswal.

### 29,000 firms, 44,000 cr GST evasion exposed in fake invoice crackdown

**Delhi:** Finance Ministry on Sunday reported that over 29,000 fake firms were identified and over 44,000 crores of GST tax evasion detected in a nationwide drive over 7 1/2 months. The Ministry disclosed the results of a special drive to identify non-existent/bogus registrations and issue fake invoices without any underlying supply of goods and services. The drive started in mid-May last year. "A total of 29,273 bogus firms involved in suspected ITC evasion of 44,015 crore have been detected. This has saved 4,646 crore of which 3,802 crore is by blocking ITC and 844 crore is by way of recovery. So far, 121 arrests have been made in the cases," a finance ministry statement said. All Central and State tax administrations launched a special All-India Drive on May 16, 2023, to detect suspicious/fake GSTINs, conduct requisite verification, and take further remedial action to weed out fake billers from the GST ecosystem and safeguard government revenue. Based on detailed data analytics and risk parameters, GSTN identified fraudulent GSTINs for State and Central Tax authorities in the drive. It was planned that details of such identified suspicious GSTINs, jurisdiction-wise, would be shared with the concerned State/Central Tax administration to initiate a verification drive and conduct necessary action. If, after detailed verification, it is found that the taxpayer is non-existent and fictitious, action will be initiated for suspension and cancellation of the taxpayer's registration. Further, the matter may be examined for blocking the input tax credit in the Electronic Credit Ledger.

## GST departments on an overdrive with notices and summons

**Delhi:** But tax notices have been issued to companies across sectors from consumer durables and smartphones to insurance and banking to online gaming and service providers. What has left India Inc worried is not just the multiplicity of notices, lack of uniform process, poor coordination between Centre and state tax authorities, and even understanding in the case of certain tax officials of the VAT (Value-Added Tax) era. Concerns around interpretation also exist as such notices mostly pertain to the initial implementation phase of GST, when there were several teething troubles and constant tweaks in policy decisions.

● **Sending show cause notices for FY 2017-18, which was the first year of the GST regime**

After sector-specific probes, the scope of the notices over the past few months expanded to cover "underpayment" of tax, "incorrect availment of input tax credit" and "reconciliations differences" between returns filed and financials. This picked up pace before the end of three-year limitation period on September 30 for sending show cause notices for FY 2017-18, which was the first

year of the GST regime. The limitation period begins after the filing of annual returns for the year to which the demand is related. Deadlines for filing annual returns had been repeatedly extended during the initial GST phase and later during the COVID-19 pandemic, hence, the limitation period for 2017-18 was also extended till September 30 this year. Notices have also been sent for subsequent years from FY19 to FY22. Dabur India, LIC, Bajaj Allianz, ICICI Prudential, Star Health and Allied Insurance, Maruti Suzuki, Akzo Nobel, Sheela Foam and ICICI Lombard General Insurance are among companies that have received notices or tax demands.

## New e-comm hubs: Parts of Hindi heartland, northeast with ease and are comfort

**Delhi:** Northeast and parts of the Hindi heartland are emerging as the new e-commerce hotspots, fuelling the next wave of growth for the estimated over \$80 billion industry, according to a recent study jointly conducted by consulting firm Kearney and Meesho.

Helped by rising disposable incomes and consumer appetite for varied options and styles, cities like Varanasi, Allahabad, Gorakhpur, Noida,



Jamshedpur and Ranchi are increasingly taking to online shopping. The trend is also in part being driven by the restricted presence of offline retail in some regions in the northeast for instance, geographical build of certain areas makes it difficult for offline retailers to set up shops. Imphal, Agartala,

Silchar and Shillong are among cities in the northeast which are home to digitally savvy consumers who can navigate online apps with ease and are comfortable shopping online. "Consumers in northeastern states have been early adopters of many modern trends, including the Korean cultural wave (K-fashion, K-drama, Korean skincare). Evolving demand there is typically not serviced well by the limited presence of retail, which encour-

ages digitally astute consumers to shop online," an analyst said. E-commerce players, who largely catered to consumers in metros and tier-1 cities in their initial phase of expansion, have been building capabilities to service tier-2 regions and beyond, where several customers with large wallets are more than willing to spend on a range of online products to avail the convenience of doorstep deliveries that e-tail offers.

## Saudi oil price cut to offer India room for better deals

**Delhi:** Saudi Aramco cut OSP (official selling price) of flagship Arab Light crude for Asia to their lowest in 27 months, a move that can work well for India if it prompts oil to slide further to boost prospects of cheaper fuel for consumers and keep the energy import bill from bloating. Aramco slashed the OSP by \$2 per barrel for February shipments, marking the second consecutive reduction after the \$1.5 per barrel discount announced in December for January loading. The world's largest oil exporter also pruned prices for North America, North West Europe and the Mediterranean. The Saudi move is seen as a bid to protect market share amid onslaught from rival producers. Asia is important as it is considered the growth engine for global oil demand because of



China and India the world's second and third-largest oil consumers, respectively. Saudi Arabia sees a serious competition from the US fracking boom as shale oil found its way into Asia around 2017. The tectonic shift in the global energy flow sparked by Moscow's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 and emergence of new suppliers in South America and Africa poses a bigger challenge. India and China have been lapping up the Russian barrels shunned by western buyers since the Ukraine war as sanc-

tions and banking curbs on Moscow made payments difficult. Before the war, Russia accounted for less than 1% of India's oil imports. Today, it has replaced Saudi Arabia as the second-biggest supplier on the back of hefty discounts. China and India account for 80% of Russian oil exports. Russia's gain has come at Saudi Arabia's expense as the discounts by Russian sellers, an opaque shipping system and elevated prices kept the oil flowing in spite of the G7 price cap of \$60 per barrel.

## Indian single malts pip foreign brands in sales, overtake global giants for 1st time

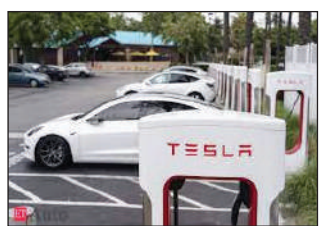
**Delhi:** Move over Glenlivet, Macallan, Lagavulin and Talisker - it's now time for homegrown single malts, whose sales have for the first time overtaken those produced by the global giants. Early estimates prepared by industry body Confederation of Indian Alcoholic Beverage Companies (CIABC) show that Indian single malts have cornered a share of around 53% of total sales in 2023. Of the total sales of around 6,75,000 cases (of nine litres each) of single malts in India last year, around 3,45,000 cases were retailed by Indian-origin makers, while the remaining 3,30,000 were by



Scottish and others. "In our estimate, the local brands grew by around 23% in 2023, while the imported ones grew at a more conservative 11%. This is a milestone," Vinod Giri, director-general of CIABC, told T8OI. The numbers are seen as a milestone for homegrown players. "It's not everyday that such a feat is achieved. From being mocked around till just a decade-and-a-half back, Indian whisky makers have come a long way as they are now second to none in terms of quality and refinement," says Thrivikram Nikam, joint MD of Amrut Distilleries. The craze for 'Made in India' brands has prompted Diageo and Pernod Ricard which source their single

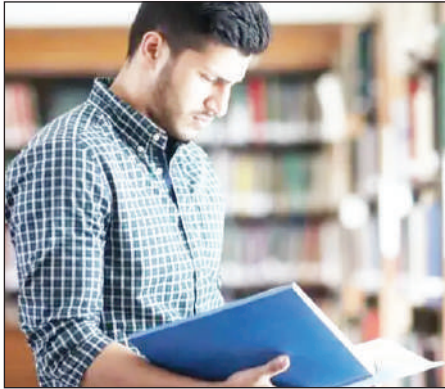
malts mainly from Scotland, to join the party launching local brands. Diageo had introduced the Godawan in 2022, while Pernod recently launched its first Indian single malt Longitude 77. "India is a fast-growing market and very diverse, with the younger audience experimenting and gravitating towards niche products. Consumers want new stuff, and there is a lot of value in newness," says Kartik Mohindra, chief marketing officer at Pernod India. Paul P John, chairman of John Distilleries that makes its single malts in Goa, says the foreign brands are "panicking now" as Indian companies grow bigger.

## BYD overtakes Tesla as biggest EV marks



**Delhi:** These figures underscore the challenges Tesla will likely face this year, from competitors keen to capitalize on the growing demand for EVs. Tesla's stock slipped after the news was announced, before regaining ground. As well as besting Tesla in pure electric vehicle sales, BYD sold more than 400,000 plug-in hybrid electric vehicles in the fourth quarter. In total, it sold more than three million passenger vehicles last year. However, Tesla was still the top seller of EVs on an annual basis, delivering more than 1.8 million vehicles to customers in the year to December, well above BYD's sales figure of just under 1.6 million.

## CBSE mandates schools to file SQAA focusing on curriculum

**Divya Delhi:** The CBSE schools have been directed to file the annual self-assessment under the School Quality Assessment and Assurance Framework (SQAAF) which was introduced in March 2023. This will be the first year for the schools to apply for the SQAA 2023-24 to evaluate the quality enhancement processes on parameters set under SQAAF. The schools were expected to submit the SQAA report between April 1 and December 31, 2023, the deadline was extended to March 31, 2024, as only 40% of schools submitted the assessment report. Speaking to Education

Times, Pragya Singh, director, school assessment, CBSE, says, "To maintain the standard of education, the schools are being assessed on curriculum, pedagogy and assessment, which carries 40% weightage. Standards have been prepared in different areas of school functioning like curriculum, pedagogy, assessment, infrastructure, inclusive practices, human resources, management and governance, leadership, and beneficiary satisfaction against which the schools can assess for quality interventions."

Schools have participated in the self-assessment in seven

domains through specific performance indicators (as given under the standards). The CBSE has made it mandatory for all its affiliated schools that are applying for fresh affiliation/switch over/upgrade/extension of schools from the session 2023-24 onwards to submit self-assessment under SQAAF vide circular no 14 available on SARAS Portal. "Schools whose extension is not due may also undertake self-assessment as mentioned in SQAAF portal. The department will also review the infrastructure of a few randomly selected schools," says Singh.

## Delhi Nursery Admissions 2024: First List to Be Released On January 12

**Divya Delhi:** Private schools in Delhi are set to release the first list of candidates selected for admission to nursery, kindergarten (KG), and Class 1 on January 12 for the academic year 2024-25. Schools began disclosing the final grades given to each candidate last

Friday as part of the admissions process, which began on November 23. For 25 per cent of the seats at private schools allotted to the economically disadvantaged segment (EWS), the Department of Education (DoE) will supervise the cen-

tralised online admissions process. According to officials, schools will conduct a draw of lots before determining the final list in situations where two or more students have similar scores. The deadline for the admissions process is set for March 8.

January 27, 2023, will mark the start of the rectification window, which ends on January 29, 2023.

## How UK's new visa rules will impact Indian students, workers & their dependents

**Divya Delhi:** The UK has introduced new student visa rules that prevent international students from bringing their parents, partners or children with them starting 1 January, unless they are pursuing a PhD or postgraduate research courses. Under the dependent visa, international students, barring undergraduates, could bring their family members, including spouses and children, to

the UK. The new restrictions will impact international students at the postgraduate level and in non-research courses. The UK has been a favoured destination for Indian students seeking higher education abroad, shows Bureau of Immigration data.

In 2022, around

55,000 Indian students were studying in the UK, according to Indian foreign ministry statistics. UK Home Office data showed that 1,42,848 sponsored study visas were issued to Indians in the year ending June 2023 — a 54 per cent rise from the year ending June 2022. Of the 5,00,000 sponsored UK study-related visas issued in June 2023, almost 1,54,000 were granted to students' dependents. Indians accounted for almost a third of sponsored UK study visas during this time, according to the UK Home Office. The new rules also require that those pursuing PhDs must have studied for at least 24 months before switching to a work visa, such as a skilled worker visa.

## Science centres to come up at 2 govt ..

**Divya Delhi:** Delhi government has decided to set up science centres at two state-run schools with exhibits and interactive models on virtual reality, immersive experience, augmented reality, holographic projections and astronomy apart from physics, chemistry, biology and mathematics. The science centres will be located in schools at Vasant Vihar and Karol Bagh. The aim of Directorate of Education (DoE) is to equip such educational facilities that provide



an effective method to students to learn science by way of leveraging interactive display of models and exhibits that demystify the modern world of technology and innovations," said an official. Officials said DoE

will soon identify experienced agencies to design the rooms and open areas and the exhibits and interactive models at the science centres. While technical specifications of all models and exhibits will be

framed by the agency concerned, the final approval will have to come from the education department. The total cost of the project is likely to be about Rs 3 crore. The aim of Directorate of Education (DoE) is to equip such educational facilities that provide an effective method to students to learn science by way of leveraging interactive display of models and exhibits that demystify the modern world of technology and innovations," said an official.

## 85 IIT-Bombay students get Rs 1cr-plus

**Divya Delhi:** Many as 85 IIT Bombay students have bagged cool crore-plus annual pay packages in the first phase of placements. Most of the higher salaries on the IIT-B campus during this year's placement season seem to have come from the research and development space, the average annual salary for which stood at Rs 36.9 lakh, up from the previous year's Rs 32.25 lakh. In contrast, the finance sector that is hogged by algo trading firms saw a drop of 22% in average yearly compensation to Rs 32.4 lakh from Rs 41.7 lakh last year. Other sectors, including IT, software and consulting, saw a marginal rise in the overall average pay in the first phase of campus placements. "Our students have put in a lot of effort to match up to the



requirements of the companies. Many firms conducted interviews online which is not very easy to crack. Offers have been staggering and are coming in small waves. International recruitment is slow as the geopolitical scenario is not favourable and this is an election year in India, so many companies are just adopting a wait-and-watch policy," said a placement officer.

In the first phase that ended on December 20, a total of 63 students accepted international offers. Most of the interna-

tional offers have come from Japan, Taiwan, South Korea, Netherlands, Singapore and Hong Kong. Despite global and economic uncertainties, IIT-B saw a total of 1,340 offers being made till December 20, which resulted in 1,188 students getting placed. This included seven students placed in PSUs as well as 297 PPOs via internships, of which 258 were accepted.

The number of offers received overall, though, were lower than last year's phase one of placements.

## The medical college canteen offers only nutritious meal options

**Divya Delhi:** All AIIMS, PGIMER, JIPMER, and other Institutes of National Importance (INIs) have received advice from the Center to make sure that their college canteens offer healthier options in place of high-fat, high-sugar beverages and other items associated with non-communicable diseases. The government has recommended whole grains, millets, and fresh produce as better substitutes. "Even small steps can have a huge impact on the nation's and society's health," Dr. Atul Goel, director general of health services (DGHS), wrote to medical colleges. According to Dr. Goel's letter, non-communicable diseases (NCDs) are thought to be responsible for approximately 63% of all deaths in the nation. Cardiovascular illnesses accounted for the highest percentage of NCD deaths (27%), followed by malignancies (9%),



diabetes (3%) and other disorders (13%). "Unhealthy diets, fast food (such as burgers, pizzas etc) and sugary beverages contribute enormously to the ever-increasing NCD burden," according to the DGHS. A similar letter advocating for a prohibition on alcohol use at med-

ical conferences was sent by the DGHS to all medical groups the previous year. The letter explained the connections between alcohol consumption and a number of illnesses and injuries, such as cancer, hemorrhagic strokes, and liver cirrhosis.

## PG med students to get weekly off, 20 CLs to ensure work-life balance

**Divya Delhi:** In a major overhaul aimed at ensuring work-life balance of post-graduate (PG) medical students, National Medical Commission (NMC) has decided that all PG students will be eligible for a weekly off and at least 20 days of casual leave per year. The gazette notification issued on January 1, however, did not define "work hours" for resident doctors, which has been a demand of associations across the country. It mentions that doctors have to work for "reasonable working hours" and that they will be provided "reasonable time for rest" in a day. "We have been raising the issue of defining minimum and maximum working hours for a long time. It is sad that this crucial issue hasn't been addressed properly in the new notification," said Aviral Mathur, president of the Federation of Resident Doctors Association (FORDA).
