

## Navy tests missile, IAF launches huge drill



**Divya Delhi:** Indian Navy's guided missile destroyer INS Surat on Thursday completed a successful test of a medium-range surface-to-air missile with an approximate range of 70 km. Meanwhile, Indian Air Force (IAF) executed 'Exercise Aakraman', a comprehensive operational drill across the central sector, featuring its premier fighter aircraft, including the Rafale jets. The timing of IAF and navy drills is significant as it comes two days after a deadly terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam that claimed the lives of 26 people. Following the incident, there has been an increase in tensions between India and Pakistan with the former suspending the Indus treaty. Pakistan responded with retaliatory measures by suspending the 1972 Simla Agreement. "The Indian Navy's latest indigenous guided missile destroyer INS Surat has successfully carried out a precision cooperative engagement of a sea-skimming target, marking a significant milestone in strengthening the Navy's defence capabilities," the Navy said.

## With BJD's help, NDA numbers rise, and RS passes waqf bill 128-95

**Divya Delhi:** India on Thursday rattled Pakistan amid strong signals of a buildup to a Pulwama-type retaliation, or even a stronger response, to avenge the Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 innocent tourists. The stage was set by Prime Minister Narendra Modi who echoed the anger of the nation when he declared that "India will identify, track, and punish every terrorist and their backers" and will "pursue them to the ends of the Earth" to punish them "beyond their imagination." The Prime Minister's strong message was followed by a slew of counter-measures to convey a clear message to Pakistan for its support of cross-border terrorism. All existing valid visas to Pakistani nationals revoked with effect from April 27. Medical visas issued to Pakistani nationals to be valid only till April 29. Indian nationals already in Pakistan urged to return home at the earliest. These moves followed five key decisions that were announced a day earlier on

Before the next hearing, the court allowed the Centre to submit a comprehensive response to the petitions that challenged the constitutional validity of the Wakf Amendment Act, 2025 through the filing of a thorough response. A day after the highest court indicated that the current law has flaws that it intends to correct by means of an interim order, the solicitor general Tushar Mehta

## Kerala native's zip-lining video records chilling footage of Baisaran massacre

**Divya Delhi:** What began as a joyful afternoon zip-lining through scenic Baisaran soon turned into a scene of horror for Nihal and his family, residents of Kerala's Kozhikode. While filming a family member enjoying the ride, they inadvertently captured chilling

footage of terrorists gunning down innocent people. Nihal, his cousins and the mother of one of the cousins reached the valley around 2.20pm and immediately went for the zip-lining ride. "I was waiting at the starting point and focusing

on my cousin who went on the zip-line before me. It was when she reached middle of ride that I heard a gunshot. I thought it was the sound of crackers, only to notice a man 100m away holding a weapon and a woman lying on the ground.

## Pakistani Hindu woman may lose son on short-term visa

**Divya Delhi:** Radha Bheel, a 27-year-old Pakistani national living near Jaisalmer, is faced with the prospect of being separated from her toddler son just days after their emotional reunion. And the cause of her despair is India's decision to revoke Pakistani visas with immediate effect in response to the Pahalgam terror attack, with all Pakistani nationals ordered to return to their country by April 27. Radha's plight is shared by many Pakistani Hindu families in Rajasthan who are on short term visas (STVs). In Jaisalmer alone, a pall of gloom has descended over 1,200 Pakistani citizens on STVs. As for those on long term visas (LTVs), ASP (CID)



Narpat Singh, who's also the Foreign Regional Registration Officer (FRRO), said his office is awaiting orders from home ministry and assured that long-term visa holders need not be concerned for now. Radha, her husband Raju Ram (30), and their two daughters, aged 8 and 7, arrived in India on an LTV in Feb 2023. However, the couple's son,

Ghanshyam, who was then less than two months old, was denied a visa, as were Raju Ram's parents. It took two years for Ghanshyam and his grandparents to finally arrive in India on an STV on April 6. "I waited for two years to hold my baby but will have to bear parting with him once again," she told TOI, tears streaming down her face.

## MP man held for inflammatory post

**Divya Delhi:** Madhya Pradesh police arrested Md Osaf Khan, a 27-year-old from Jabalpur, for posting an offensive comment on social media regarding a recent terrorist attack. Khan's comment targeted a woman near the victim's body, suggesting her involvement in the crime. This arrest follows the apprehension of two other youths in Damoh district for similar objectionable comments related to the killings. Madhya Pradesh police Thursday arrested a 27-year-old youth for allegedly making a vile comment on a social media post related to the terrorist attack.

## Pilgrims petition the PM because 42k can't attend Haj

**Divya Delhi:** Muslim pilgrims and community leaders have asked PM Narendra Modi for help after the minority affairs ministry said 42,000 applicants won't be able to undertake Hajj in June. The ministry said on X that 1,22,518 pilgrims will travel to Saudi Arabia through Haj Committee of India. After the Saudi government shut down Nusuk, 52,000 pilgrims' reservation through private tour operators, dubbed combined Haj group operators (CHGOs), was canceled. After the ministry's intervention, Saudi



Arabia unlocked the portal for 10,000 of 52,000 pilgrims. Congress MLA Amin Patel said several pilgrims had asked him to address the cancellation. "I spoke to many tour operators who said they had booked pilgrims three months ago and now they are helpless," he said. "42,000 is a large figure, so I've

asked PM Modi and others to talk to Saudi leaders. If they can go to Hajj in 2026, the backlog will be massive," Patel added. The ministry of minority affairs accused PTOs for delays in uploading paperwork and completing Nusuk portal payments. One CHGO blamed the delay on the Nusuk portal's inactive IBAN.

Nagaon police station". "We have seen a video where the MLA is defending Pakistan and its complicity in the attack. I had instructed the police to take action and accordingly, the DGP has informed me that

he has been arrested," Assam CM Himanta Biswa Sarma said at a press conference. "The MLA will be produced before a court and we will take the case to its logical conclusion," he added.

## Ramdev Ensnared in Legal Trouble

**Divya Delhi :** New legal problems have arisen for yoga teacher Ramdev. The patanjali ayurveda founder's "sherbet jihad" comment against the squash drink Rooh Afza was deemed "indefensible" and "shook the conscience" of the court by the Delhi High Court. At the hearing of the case brought up by Rooh Afza producer Hamdard, Justice Amit Bansal remarked, "It shocks the conscience of the court. This is indefensible," according to Live Law. Ramdev had earlier this month released a music video promoting Patanjali's



rose sherbet. Without naming Hamdard, he said, "A company uses money earned from selling sherbet to build mosques and madrasas. If you drink that sherbet, mosques and madrasas will be built. But if you drink Patanjali rose sherbet,

gurukuls and Patanjali university will be built. Like love jihad and vote jihad, a sherbet jihad is also on." When the video sparked a row, Ramdev said he did not name any brand. Rooh Afza manufacturer Hamdard went to court against Ramdev and

sought the removal of the video from social media. Appearing for Hamdard, Senior Advocate Mukul Rohatgi said it was a shocking case that goes beyond the disparagement of the Rooh Afza product and is also a case of "communal divide." He said Ramdev's remarks were like hate speech. Mr Rohatgi said Ramdev's Patanjali was a well-known brand that The senior attorney also brought up the ongoing Supreme Court case involving deceptive advertising involving Ramdev and his associate Balkrishna.



## NEET aspirant from Delhi found dead in bushes in Rajasthan

**Divya Delhi:** A 23-year-old NEET aspirant from Delhi was found dead in bushes near the railway track in the Landmark City area under Kunhadi police station early Thursday morning. The FSL squad, in its initial investigation, suspected it suicide by consuming some poisonous substance; however, no suicide note was recovered from his possession. This incident marks the second case of suicide within 48 hours in the coaching city and the 12th since January this year. On Tuesday early morning, an 18-year-old boy from Chhapra in Bihar, also a NEET aspirant, had committed suicide by hanging himself from a ceiling fan in his hostel room in Kunhadi police station area, Kota. ## Vehicles that do not have fuel stickers with color coding will be subject to penalties

**Divya Delhi:** The Delhi Transport Department has issued a new warning, stating that offenders will face consequences if they continue to operate vehicles without the High Security Number Plates (HSRPs) and corresponding stickers. According to officials, vehicles that do not have stickers that show the fuel type will not be issued Pollution Under Control (PUC) certificates. In light of a recent ruling by the Supreme Court, the Transport Department has issued a public notice which states,



"The Supreme Court has directed that PUC certificates will not be issued to vehicles unless they comply with the Motor Vehicles (High Security Registration Plates) order, 2018, for displaying colour-coded stickers/third registration mark on the windshield of the vehicle." "The

provisions of Section 192(1) of the Motor Vehicle Act 1988... will also be applied in the event of non-compliance," the warning continued. Owners face fines or jail time for improper vehicle registration under Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, Section 192(1).

### Not yet banned: CNG cars and petrol bikes

**Divya Delhi:** The Delhi cabinet withdrew its suggestion to phase out CNG auto rickshaws and fossil fuel-powered two-wheelers under its new e-vehicle policy on Tuesday. After a cabinet meeting, transport minister Pankaj Singh said CNG auto operators will not be required to switch to electric. Motorcycles would be unrestricted.

"All vehicles will continue to ply on the capital's roads," he stated. The next EV policy draft proposes replacing CNG-powered three-wheelers with e-auto rickshaws by August. From August 15, next year, the draft proposes banning petrol, diesel, and CNG two-wheeler registration. The current EV policy, which expired on Tuesday, was

extended by three months, according to government sources. The present EV policy offers a 25% purchase subsidy (up to Rs 5,500) for e-cycles, Rs 30,000 for e-rickshaws and e-carts, Rs 5,000 per kWh of battery capacity (limited at Rs 30,000) for two-wheelers, and Rs 30,000 for e-light commercial vehicles.

### Some worker relief: Min wages rise in capital

**Divya Delhi:** The Delhi government has raised the minimum wage for all categories to help workers. The revised rates span several skill levels. Unskilled workers now receive Rs 18,456 per month, up from Rs 18,066. Up from Rs

19,929. Semi-skilled workers would receive Rs 20,371. Skilled workers, including non-matriculated ones, would earn Rs 22,411, up from Rs 21,917. Graduates will earn Rs 24,356 instead of Rs 23,836. The increased rates take effect on April 1, 2025, to help workers cope with inflation. The Delhi government said the minimum salary increase will protect their purchasing power amid growing costs. A senior government official said, "This salary boost helps workers cope with inflation and provides much-needed financial respite. The hike is meant to balance rising living costs, especially in Delhi, where many workers are struggling financially." Inflation affects numerous economic sectors, he added. The Delhi government is supporting workers, especially low-wage workers, with the rise."



## Policy tweak may raise cost of owning non-EVs

**Divya Delhi:** The Delhi government has proposed a significant tweak to its existing electric vehicle (EV) policy, which may lead to an increase in the cost of petrol and CNG vehicles, people aware of the plan said. The policy tweak, the people said, will lead to the extending of an existing "green cess" — currently applicable only for diesel vehicles — to all internal combustion engine (ICE) vehicles, thereby increasing their cost. This, they said, is being proposed in order to disincentive the sale of petrol and CNG vehicles in the Capital. Another option that is being explored is hiking the cost of petrol and CNG in the city, they said. Delhi's EV Policy 2020 — which charges a cess of 1%



### CBI raids AAP's Gujarat poll in-charge Durgesh Pathak's house in FCRA violation case

**Divya Delhi:** The CBI on Thursday launched searches at the premises of former AAP MLA Durgesh Pathak and 2027 Gujarat assembly poll in-charge in connection with a case registered under the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA), news agency ANI reported. Last month, the Aam Aadmi Party had appointed senior leaders Durgesh Pathak and Gopal Rai as in-charges for the 2027 Gujarat assembly elections, signaling its intent to expand its footprint in the BJP stronghold.

### MPs Get 24% Salary, Pension Increase; New Allowances

**Divya Delhi:** MPs' wages would rise 24%, along with pensions and allowances for former MPs, according to the Indian government. The Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs notified these adjustments, matching them with the 1961 Income Tax Act Cost Inflation Index. This national revision follows the Karnataka government's large wage boost for the Chief Minister, ministers, and MLAs. The monthly remuneration of the Chief Minister has quadrupled from 75,000 to 1.5 lakh.

## Card changes could restrict free bus rides for women to residents only

**Divya Delhi:** According to transport department authorities, eight NCR lines are operated by the Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC), which connects Delhi to other satellite cities, including Gurugram, Noida, Ghaziabad, and Greater Noida. Women residing in these locations may not be eligible for the smart card program if it needs verification of Delhi residency. The "lifetime smart cards" that the Delhi government is planning to introduce in place of the pink tickets that



women use for free bus rides may only be available to women who live in the Capital, according to sources acquainted with the matter. This is because, upon registration, the government may ask for proof of address. The transport department

in Delhi has started planning the logistics of the new smart card scheme, only days after chief minister Rekha Gupta announced them in her budget speech. We anticipate that the cards will be distributed following April 25.

## Delhi government has authorized GPS in water tankers

**Divya Delhi:** In an effort to control the "tanker mafia" and close the demand-supply imbalance, the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) will run 1,111 GPS-enabled water tankers this summer, according to chief minister Rekha Gupta. At a ceremony to welcome the tankers to Burari, Chief Minister Gupta announced that the technology will aid in the prevention of leaks and allow for the tracking of tanker locations on an IT dashboard at the headquarters of the DJB. Rapping the previous Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government for alleged failures in the tanker system, she said: "In the previous government, there was a leakage in the entire system in the name of tanker mafias.



Corruption occurred. The ordinary people were given water, but its whereabouts remained a mystery. Providing access to clean water is a top priority for Delhi's new administration. One thousand eleven tankers are being dispatched. Each one can be followed thanks to its GPS capability. It is possible to track the whereabouts of each tanker. ### Govt allocates 12,952 crore for public transport system

The BJP government, led by Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, presented its maiden budget on Tuesday, March 25. Gupta presented 1 lakh crore budget for 2025-26, a 31.56% increase from last year. In the budget for the financial year 2025-26, the government has allocated 12,952 crore to improve Delhi's public transport system. It has allocated 1,000 crore to improve the connectivity of Delhi with the NCR region.

## BJP will also have the Delhi mayor after the CM

**Divya Delhi :** The new Delhi mayor will be elected on April 25. There are no party candidates for mayor. The Aam Aadmi Party will not run for mayor. Aam Aadmi Party will stand aside in the Mayor race. This party decision was revealed in a news conference by former Chief Minister Atishi and Saurabh Bhardwaj. Saurabh Bhardwaj stated the BJP is harassing, threatening, and wooing Aam Aadmi Party councilors. We will not run for mayor, he stated. Saurabh Bhardwaj said the BJP should make its Mayor notwithstanding and run the four-engine

### EWS certificate controversy: AAP and Congress criticize the government

Saurabh Bharadwaj, the chairman of AAP's Delhi branch, accused the government of penalizing the general populace for administrative failures.

## Man stabbed to death, 2 injured in clash after dispute over bidi

**Divya Delhi:** A 21-year-old man was fatally stabbed, while his brother and a friend sustained serious injuries following a violent altercation in South East Delhi's Pul Prahladpur on Monday night. The incident reportedly stemmed from a dispute over a bidi. According to police,

the conflict began in a nearby park when Sohaib, the deceased, was approached by two men—Munna and Sunny—who asked him for a bidi. When he refused, they allegedly slapped him. Sohaib returned home and informed his mother about the incident.

His mother, Sabukta (55), accompanied by Sohaib and his brother Mohsin, went to confront the attackers at their residence. During the confrontation, the situation escalated. Firoz, along with Sunny and Imtiyaz, allegedly attacked the trio with knives. Sohaib suffered multiple stab

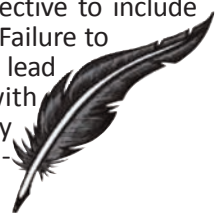

## Maharashtra: Is The 'Marathi Manooos' Still Listening To Raj Thackeray?

It was the late Bal Thackeray's Marathi card that had once propelled Shiv Sena to the top in Mumbai, India's financial capital. Now, with a string of electoral defeats behind him, Raj Thackeray, the flamboyant nephew of the Shiv Sena founder, is seeking to take a leaf out of his uncle's book. The Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) chief is trying to re-establish relevance in Mumbai and other urban centres ahead of the upcoming municipal elections by reviving the 'Marathi manooos' plank through the Marathi card. A few days ago, a combative Thackeray stirred controversy by warning that his party would not hesitate to "slap" those who refuse to speak Marathi in the state. His aim is clear: to encroach upon the 'son of the soil' space traditionally held by the Shiv Sena. The Uddhav Thackeray-led faction is still reeling from its assembly election setback, while the Eknath Shinde-led Sena is struggling to assert itself amid the Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) growing dominance. Simultaneously, Raj Thackeray is signalling a willingness to align with the BJP, which has consolidated its position in Maharashtra a decade after emerging as the state's largest party. For Raj, the municipal polls represent a now-or-never opportunity to revive his political fortunes. His party failed to win a single assembly seat, and even his son Amit lost in their family stronghold. Though known for his oratory and style reminiscent of his uncle, Raj Thackeray has never contested an election himself. His current campaign seems aimed not just at voters, but at the BJP—to remind it that he still holds sway in Mumbai. For the BJP, these elections are a chance to further marginalise Uddhav's party while preventing Shinde from gaining too much ground. Balancing these interests requires deft political management. Interestingly, Shinde's Sena has not championed the 'Marathi Manooos' cause, and is often seen as the BJP's 'B team'. Ajit Pawar's Nationalist Congress Party (NCP), often dubbed the 'C team', prioritises power under the guise of development, largely ignoring regional identity issues. The language issue has regained emotional traction in a Mumbai that is increasingly cosmopolitan but still home to a significant Marathi-speaking population. No political party in Maharashtra can afford to ignore the Marathi language debate - it can either stir passions or be used to discredit opponents. Shiv Sena once led vigorous campaigns, even tearing down non-Marathi signboards. Those were the days when Bal Thackeray ruled Mumbai with an iron grip. He famously claimed he could shut down the city with just two phone calls - to PTI and UNI. He openly espoused "thokshahi", that is, rule by force, with his followers even backing him with action - which included vandalising a cricket pitch ahead of a match with Pakistan. While Raj Thackeray didn't split the Sena like Shinde did, he's now attempting to hijack Bal Thackeray's legacy through the Marathi plank. This comes as Uddhav's party faces defections in Mumbai and the Konkan region, its traditional strongholds. Thackeray and the BJP may have a shared goal of limiting Shinde's influence, but that's easier said than done. Thackeray's biggest challenge has been his inconsistency. He has often been accused of abandoning causes midway, which has hurt his credibility. Whether Thackeray has changed after his latest electoral setback remains to be seen. He remains a powerful Marathi orator, reminiscent of Bal Thackeray at his peak. His success in reviving his political magic will be determined by how far the Marathi card takes him. Just yesterday, Thackeray issued a stern warning to the Indian Banks Association, urging immediate compliance with the RBI directive to include Marathi in banking services. Failure to do so, he cautioned, would lead to intensified protests, with banks bearing responsibility for any resulting law-and-order disruptions.

Is it not a crime legally if someone's belongings are snatched and half of the belongings are given to him without paying any money? It is definitely a crime. But now the Madhya Pradesh government will openly commit this crime under the guise of law, and this law is the Nagar and Gram Nivesh Amendment Bill 2025. Although this bill has not become a law yet, but by forcibly bringing this bill in the assembly, the BJP government of Madhya Pradesh, in which the Chief Minister is Mohan Yadav, wants to usurp the fertile agricultural land of the farmers. The BJP government of Madhya Pradesh led by Mohan Yadav has made a plan to snatch the land of the farmers and give it to the leaders and capitalists, and it is so adamant about this that it is not even listening to the opposition. Is it not the dictatorship of the government to forcibly snatch someone's land without giving compensation. Actually, now in Madhya Pradesh, the government has started taking steps to acquire land for



development work. Preparations have been made to make a different kind of law, named Nagar and Gram Nivesh Amendment Bill 2025. As soon as this bill becomes law, instead of acquiring land and giving compensation to the farmers, the Madhya Pradesh government will adopt the method of land pooling and the farmers whose land will be taken will not have to pay any compensation. So they will neither have the right to save the land nor will the government give them compensation. That is, the land will be excavated for free and 50 percent of that land will be given to the farmers. The government is saying that instead of giving compensation to the land owners i.e. farmers in lieu of land, 50 percent of that land will be developed and given as a plot or land. The government's development of

land does not mean that it will give 50 percent of the land to the farmers by building buildings or opening businesses on it, rather it will give the farmers the land that is around the project.

For example, if the government wants to build an airport by taking the land of 100 farmers, then the farmers will have to pay the price for the land. Whatever new settlement will be built at a short distance from the airport, half of the land will be given to it. This means that the farmers will be cheated completely and the government will grab the land for the airport for free.

And it is obvious that the government is not going to give 50% share in the airport to the farmers, so if it has to give 100% share for the airport. If they need 10 acres of land, they will first snatch 200 acres of land from the

farmers and after building the airport on 100 acres, they will return the remaining 100 acres to them, saying that this land has been given to the farmers near the airport, which has been developed, meaning its price has increased. Anyway, the question is that by snatching the uncultivated agricultural land, the BJP government of Madhya Pradesh will show its favour by giving half of their livelihood to the farmers and saying that it has given them land more valuable than their land. Actually, the BJP government of Madhya Pradesh is doing all this according to the Gujarat model, which is of no use to the common man. But still the BJP government of Madhya Pradesh has implemented this bill. After this bill becomes a law, it will not be applicable only on the acquisition of irrigated agricultural land and Simhastha fair area Ujjain, it will be applicable everywhere else.

The opposition is opposing this bill, the farmers of the state are also opposing this bill, but the BJP government of Madhya Pradesh is so intoxicated with power that it does not care about it. And the bigger thing is that by giving legal form to this bill, the Madhya Pradesh government wants to usurp the land of the farmers, as well as. The government also

wants to grab about 37 lakh hectares of forest land. And the government is saying that this land will not be taken for small investments, it will be taken only when an investment proposal for at least 40 hectares of land is received. This clearly means that the BJP government of Madhya Pradesh is preparing to snatch the cultivable land of the farmers for the big capitalists, for which the Town and Country Planning Department will approve the project of the capitalists within 17 months, i.e. there will be no delay and then the government will forcibly snatch the land from the farmers and even if a farmer does not want to give his land, he will not be able to do so, i.e. the police will put pressure on him and get the land occupied by the capitalists. Earlier, a similar attempt was made by the Modi government at the Centre to snatch the land of the farmers of the entire country by bringing three black agriculture laws, then the farmers of the entire country had protested against it by organizing a big farmers' movement, but now the government has adopted the method of bringing laws to snatch the land of such farmers one by one in the states, so that the farmers of the country do not get angry and do not unite and start a movement again.

## In Bihar Assembly Elections, Youths Hold The Key

In Bihar, 70 per cent of the population is under 35 years old, which is just about true of many parts of India. Yet, politicians and political parties do not address their concerns. Take Tejashwi Yadav of the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) for example. He promised 10 lakh jobs in the 2020 assembly elections, which seems to have struck a chord with the youth electorate. He claims that he provided five lakh government jobs during his 17-month tenure as Bihar's deputy chief minister in the Mahagathbandhan government led by Nitish Kumar. Though one doesn't know the authenticity of the claim, the truth is he hasn't fully emerged out of the shadows of his father Lalu Prasad Yadav, who is cast in the traditional mould of regional parties pandering to the dominant caste and religious segments in a given state. The upcoming Bihar assembly elections have youth leaders spearheading the campaign, which augurs well for the state. For the Congress, the firebrand Kanhaiya Kumar, and for the BJP, the relatively young Samrat Choudhary, who could well be the CM face of the party, provided he doesn't get too carried away.

The BJP top brass cuts the claimants down to size. Prashant Kishor, the election strategist-turned-politician, will also be testing the electoral waters in the upcoming assembly elections, as he has decided to field candidates on all 243 seats. He cannot be taken lightly. He isn't exactly an upstart. He can cut into the votes of all the parties. On October 2 last year, he floated his own political outfit, the Jan Suraj Party, after the completion of his nearly two years of padayatra (foot march) that took him to all the nooks and crannies of Bihar, where he connected with the people. He is now banking on core issues of corruption, migration, and unemployment. With POTUS Donald Trump upping the ante, rattling the sabre, and unwittingly hurtling the world into the lose-lose path of autarky by mindless increases in tariffs, self-reliance in India is going to be a necessity, as indeed in the entire world. Such an inward-looking, me-too policy is the antithesis of the theory of relative advantage, which has been underpinning global trade for more than a century. Free trade is appealing and makes sense, but only till peace reigns.

## Why Nishikant won't be worried about Nadda disowning his attack on CJI Khanna

**Nishikant** Dubey has had everything it takes to be in the Bharatiya Janata Party's power clique—RSS background, proven winner with four consecutive terms in the Lok Sabha, fierce Hindutva advocate, fiery orator, astute politician, and a big loyalist of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and home minister Amit Shah. He understands the nitty-gritty of policymaking and governance much better than most ministers. And he loves to take on the who's who of the Opposition camp—from Sonia and Rahul Gandhi to Mahua Moitra. That's his feisty side as a politician. Personally, I also admire him for being a lovely family man. I have seen him sitting on a platform bench at the New Delhi Railway Station for hours, waiting for his son to return from a school trip. That was way back. Usually, even half of these qualities should catapult a leader into the big league in the BJP. Nishikant Dubey must curse his bad luck. Modi and Shah love his aggression and put him in front in the Lok Sabha and in parliamentary committees, whenever the government needs to put the Opposition down. But he hasn't really got

what he deserves for his valiant efforts—maybe a ministerial berth or a big organisational post. Nishikant Dubey's blistering attack on the Supreme Court and Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna is probably a career-defining moment for him. Especially so because BJP president JP Nadda chose to issue a statement, distancing the party from the Godda MP's remarks. Dubey has every reason to be happy about it, though. Such distancing by the BJP is, more often than not, followed up with rewards. Remember Giriraj Singh's April 2014 remarks asking people to back Modi or go to Pakistan? He was made a minister of state just a few months later. Singh hit the headlines again in 2015, when he asked whether the Congress would have accepted the leadership of Rajiv Gandhi's wife had he married "a Nigerian lady and not a white-skinned woman" like Sonia andhi. M a n y , including the Nigerian envoy in

New Delhi, took exception to this. The BJP distanced itself from Singh again. But, a couple of years later, he was elevated as a minister with independent charge. Singh, who never stopped with his controversial and communally polarising remarks, was made a full-fledged Cabinet minister in 2019. He continues to make headlines with controversial statements, even though most people may not even remember the name of the textiles minister. Look at another case—of Nitesh Rane, former Union minister Narayan Rane's legislator son. In September 2024, Nitesh, a BJP MLA, threatened to enter a mosque and hit Muslims "one by one". The BJP distanced itself from him, saying that such remarks have no place in public life.

## Watch out for Beijing's grey zone warfare. Bangladesh's China tilt should worry India

During a visit to China to strengthen business ties, Bangladesh Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus made some remarks about India's Northeast. Yunus' assertions drew an odd correlation between India's Northeastern states being landlocked, Dhaka serving as the ocean's guardian for this region, and an extension of the Chinese economy. Although his statements lacked coherence, they highlighted India's vulnerabilities, particularly regarding the strategically important Siliguri Corridor. Such com-

ments have understandably provoked a strong reaction from India, which has historically maintained a friendly relationship with Bangladesh. Not anymore, though. Yunus made these comments in China, where there was no Indian representation, at a time when bilateral relations between New Delhi and Dhaka are at their lowest since Bangladesh's independence in 1971. The political landscape in Bangladesh has shifted since the fall of the Sheikh Hasina government, which was much-favoured by

India. This has caused Bangladesh to increasingly lean toward China, raising India's strategic concerns about potential destabilisation by its immediate neighbours.

Initially, the Ministry of External Affairs chose to remain silent in the face of these uncharitable remarks. However, it soon retaliated by withdrawing transshipment facilities for Bangladesh, citing congestion at its ports and airports. In response, Bangladesh's National Board of Revenue suspended the

import of yarn from India through land ports, escalating the tit-for-tat exchange between the two nations. The Siliguri corridor, a narrow strip of land located in West Bengal, connects mainland India to its Northeastern states.

At its narrowest point, the corridor is just 22 kilometers wide, flanked by Nepal and Bhutan to the north and Bangladesh to the south. This geographical configuration has earned it the moniker "Chicken's Neck," highlighting its strategic significance.

**Divya Delhi :** According to sources familiar with the situation, Air India Ltd is considering purchasing Boeing Co planes that have been turned down by Chinese airlines. This would put it in the group of Asian airlines hoping to reap the benefits of the trade war between the US and China. Those familiar with the matter at the Indian airline, who preferred to remain anonymous due to the confidential nature of the information, said that the Tata Group-owned carrier is planning to approach Boeing regarding the purchase of several jets that the US planemaker had prepared for Chinese airlines prior to the handovers being halted by reciprocal tariffs. Whenever future delivery slots become available, Air India is also anxious to take them up, according to the people. The airline has previously profited from China's retreat; up until March, it had taken



delivery of 41 737 Max planes that were originally ordered for Chinese airlines but had their deliveries delayed due to the 2019 grounding of the aircraft. Air India and Boeing both had representatives who were unwilling to speak. Bernama said on Sunday that Malaysia Aviation Group Bhd is also in discussions with Boeing on delivery slots that have been left vacant by Chinese carriers. According to Bloomberg News, Chinese officials instructed airlines not to take Boeing planes after Beijing imposed retaliatory taxes on American goods of up to 125%.

Adani Data Networks to sell Airtel 400 MHz of 26 GHz spectrum

**Divya Delhi :** Bharti Airtel announced that it will be acquiring 400 MHz of spectrum in the 26 GHz band from Adani Data Networks Limited. Airtel and its subsidiary Bharti Hexacom have agreed to purchase spectrum usage rights in six regions of India as part of the final agreements. Some of these areas include: Andhra Pradesh (50 MHz), Tamil Nadu (50 MHz), Rajasthan (50 MHz), Gujarat (100 MHz), and Karnataka (50 MHz).

Flipkart will return to India from Singapore with Walmart backing

**Divya Delhi:** Flipkart announced that its holding company will move from Singapore to India as Walmart seeks to take the 17-year-old firm public. Due to greater initial public offering (IPO) possibilities in a country that does not allow multiple listings, many Indian firms that earlier sought funding and lower taxes are returning home from financial hotspots like Singapore and the U.S. "This move represents a natural evolution, aligning our holding structure with our core operations," Flipkart added. Flipkart, which began



selling books online in 2007, now competes with Amazon (AMZN.O) and opens a new tab in India. It transferred its parent company to Singapore in 2011. In 2018, Walmart acquired a controlling share in Flipkart and PhonePe, Flipkart's digital payments startup. PhonePe split from

Flipkart in 2022 and moved its headquarters from Singapore to India, costing Walmart roughly \$1 billion in taxes. PhonePe has started preparing for an Indian stock exchange listing. Razorpay, Pine Labs, Zepto, and InMobi are among the startups that have returned to India.

IndusInd Bank faces three senior level exits after 1,979 crore derivatives loss

**Divya Delhi:** IndusInd Bank is staring at a potential top-level shake-up following the disclosure of significant discrepancies in its derivatives portfolio, sources with knowledge of the matter told CNBC-TV18 exclusively. At least three top executives

may step down in the coming months, including CEO Sumant Kathpalia and Deputy CEO Arun Khurana, who oversaw global markets, including the derivatives portfolio, has learnt of a person directly involved in the process. The board is already working

on succession planning, following the RBI's decision to extend Kathpalia's term by just one year. According to people familiar with the matter, the RBI has asked the board to begin identifying CEO successors and submit a short-list of candidates.

DHL will block shipments worth above \$800 to customers in the United States

**Divya Delhi:** All international business-to-consumer shipments to the US that surpass \$800 will be suspended starting today, according to. Formal processing is now required for goods over \$800, a decrease from the former \$2,500 level, as a result of new U.S. customs legislation. Shipping costs less than \$800 or shipments between businesses will be unaffected, however please expect delays. The new U.S. customs regulations were the rationale given by DHL Express, a subsidiary of Deutsche Post of Germany, for the decision. Any consignment worth more than \$800 must now undergo formal entry processing, which adds further time to the already lengthy process, according to the new rules. Similarly, there is a possibility that business-to-business shipments may encounter delays in processing. There will be a temporary halt to all international shipments over \$800. DHL assured customers that shipments under \$800 will continue uninterrupted. With effect from May 2, the business has pledged to adhere to U.S. customs procedures governing shipments from Hong Kong, and it has promised to help its clients adjust to the changes.



Judge has ruled that Google's ad tech monopolies are illegal

**Divya Delhi :** The judgment sets a new precedent and allows for an upcoming hearing to decide if Google must take any action, like selling off sections of its business, to restore competition in those regions. In a case involving internet search, a court reached a similar conclusion, making this the second verdict that Google had an unlawful monopoly. As a means of storing and managing their digital ad inventory, websites utilize publisher ad servers. The technology enables news publishers and other online content providers to monetize their content through ad sales, in conjunction with ad exchanges. What Brinkema called the "lifeblood" of the internet is that money. "In addition to depriving rivals of



the ability to compete, this exclusionary conduct substantially harmed Google's publisher customers, the competitive process, and, ultimately, consumers of information on the open web," said Brinkema. Nevertheless, she noted that antitrust authorities were

unable to establish a distinct allegation regarding the company's monopoly in advertising ad networks. Judgement was hailed by U.S. Attorney General Pam Bondi as "a landmark victory in the ongoing fight to stop Google from monopolizing the digital public square."

MTNL's Rs 8,346 crore in bank debts have gone into default

**Divya Delhi:** In a regulatory filing, the state-run telecom company MTNL announced that it had failed to repay seven public sector banks for a total of 8,346.24 crore rupees. The loss-making public sector telecom firm's overall debt commitments hit Rs 33,568 crore as stated in the filing dated April 19. Financial institutions in India have been hit hard by loan defaults, with sums totaling 3,633.42 crore INR, 2,374.49 crore INR, 1,077.34 crore INR, 464.26 crore Punjab National Bank, 350.05 crore INR, 266.30 crore UCO Bank, and 180.3 crore INR in principal and interest payments alone.

Google's Android TV 'Monopoly' in India ends. Consumers must now...

**Divya Delhi:** Google will no longer be the default OS and App store on Indian Android TVs. This follows India's competition regulator's landmark verdict. Alphabet was accused by the competition watchdog of "anti-competitive practices" in India's smart TV market and trying to develop a "monopoly" in the field. The Competition Commission of India (CCI) called Google's pre-installation of its operating system, Google Play Store, and related apps under its television app distribu-



tion arrangement "misusing its dominant position" in India, one of its major markets. The CCI investigated Google and Alphabet after two Indian antitrust lawyers filed the petition. The findings revealed that the global IT behemoth created impediments for smaller enterprises developing alternative or customized Android

smart TV operating systems. After the competition watchdog's verdict, Google filed a settlement application to license its Play Store and Play Services for Android smart TVs in India separately. According to the new agreement, Google's Play Store and Play Services would charge for pre-installation.

Pincus and the Abu Dhabi Investment Authority are helping IDFC First Bank raise 7,500 crore

**Divya Delhi :** Warburg Pincus and the Abu Dhabi Investment Authority (ADIA) have stepped in with a combined injection of almost Rs 7,500 crore to drive IDFC FIRST Bank's next phase of growth, giving the lender a significant boost, according Bank. The board of directors of the bank granted a preferential equity capital issuance of 4,876 crore rupees to Warburg Pincus affiliate Currant Sea Investments B.V. and 2,624 crore rupees to Platinum Invictus B 2025 RSC Ltd, a wholly owned ADIA subsidiary overseen by the bank's Private Equities Department, according to a filing with the exchange. With this change, IDFC FIRST Bank is rounding out a six-year transition from

The promoter business will sell their Australian terminal to Adani Ports

**Divya Delhi :** The port terminal in Queensland, Australia, will be acquired by Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone Ltd (APSEZ) of Ahmedabad. The deal is non-cash and the asset has a capacity of 50 million tonnes per annum (MTPA). The enterprise value of the asset is estimated to be A\$3,975 million, which is approximately ₹21,640 crore or \$2.5 billion. Singaporean firm Carmichael Rail and Port Singapore Holdings Pte Ltd (CRPSHPL) would get 143.8 million equity shares from the Adanis'



main port venture. CRPSHPL is the legal owner of the North Queensland Export Terminal (NQXT), which is a company owned by promoters. As a result of the deal, the promoter's stake in APSEZ will increase from 61.02% to 68.02%. According to news reports, APSEZ had first bought the port facility in

2011 for approximately ₹9,000 crore. But in 2013, the public firm transferred the asset to the Adani family so that they could handle its debt. As China lifts Boeing out of the sky, Indian airlines may see a meteoric rise

**Divya Delhi :** China has told its airlines not to buy Boeing planes because of US 50000DA President Donald Trump's 145% tariffs. This could be good news for Indian carriers which are having trouble acquiring planes because of global supply chain constraints. The identical kind that Air India Express and Akasa have placed orders for, and eleven Boeing 787

Dreamliners, which are also on Air India's wish list. We expect that some of these planes, which were going to Chinese airlines, would end up going to Indian clients instead. "White tails, or aircraft made for specific customers but acquired by others, were allocated to AI Express and Akasa in the previous year or two," according to experts in the airline business.



## CBSE Orders Schools to Start Skill Education ASAP

**Divya Delhi:** The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has ordered all associated schools to implement skill education initiatives immediately to comply with the NEP 2020 and NCF-School Education. These programmes combine occupational skills into the curriculum to connect academic and practical knowledge. CBSE emphasizes speedy action to equip students for a rapidly changing workforce and create a skilled, self-reliant generation for India's future progress. CBSE offered skill modules for classes 6-12 pupils to learn in classes, hobby clubs, or online. CBSE has a registration and certification platform for project-based modules. Students can choose from 22 skill subjects for 9-10 and 43 for 11-12. These disciplines can be taught in schools without permission or fees. CBSE offers access to submit details regarding skill subjects and modules to help schools introduce



them. Skills subjects are connected to NSQF levels, giving students a clear path to career opportunities with fixed study hours. By 2026, schools must have Composite Skill Labs with skill-education equipment. The lab setup will be detailed soon. DSCs are being appointed throughout districts by CBSE to ensure grassroots implementation of these programs. Principals and instructors attend regular programs, including industrial collaborations. All skill education programs are free and CPD-recognized. To give students hands-on experience, CBSE hosts hackathons, ideathons.

### Telangana govt resolute in raising reservation

#### HYDERABAD:

Telangana Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao announced on Monday that the Congress government is determined to increase reservation for backward classes in education, employment, and political representation from 23% to 42%. In a post on the social media platform 'X', he highlighted that the population of backward classes in the state stands at 56.36%, based on the recent caste survey conducted in Telangana.

## There have been eleven private schools that have reported fee increases

**Divya Delhi:** Delhi education minister Ashish Sood read out 11 private schools that received show cause warnings for uncontrolled and unjustified pricing rises. He said that 600 schools were audited in eight days by the government. Private schools were subject to inspection by a committee consisting of district and sub-divisional magistrates. Delhi High Court observations were based on these officers' reports "Sood said. The Delhi High Court had already censured DPS Dwarka for what it called "indignity" in its handling of the fee dispute



by confining students to the library and excluding them from classes and social interactions. Stating, "Facts win wars," Sood upheld the court's ruling. Following the committee's reports, the district magistrate was directed by the high court to prevent unfairness.

It was political

will, not technical brilliance. Also, Sood said that the previous administration was wrong to do nothing for five years when private school tuition increased. These problems went unaddressed for a long time. The only time real change has occurred in Delhi is since the BJP came to power," said.

## Following a bribery scandal, NAAC fired 20% of its assessors

**Divya Delhi:** According to Anil Sahasrabudhe, chairperson of the NAAC executive Committee, more than half of the 5,300 assessors have been fired. This decision was made following the recommendations of a 10-person special committee that was established following the February

arrest of seven NAAC officials by the CBI. According to Sahasrabudhe, the number of assessors removed from NAAC's rolls was 5,364 prior to the bribery scandal, with 800 of them removed owing to data inconsistencies, protocol violations, and recommendations from

other assessors and college administrators. As part of a corruption case involving claims that KLEF in Guntur, Andhra Pradesh, was bribed to get an A++ rating from NAAC during an inspection in February, the CBI arrested ten people, including seven members of the NAAC peer team.

## Tens of thousands of teaching positions might be preserved by this six-month program offered by the Education Council

**Divya Delhi:** A large proportion of elementary school teachers in India are facing job insecurity; estimates range from three to four lakh. A six-month bridge course has been mandated by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) to try to keep these teaching jobs from being lost. Teachers with a Bachelor of Education degree who were placed in primary teaching roles in accordance with NCTE guidelines would find this course especially useful. States like Haryana, Uttar Pradesh,



and Madhya Pradesh were the most frequent locations for these kinds of recruitments. These educators will now be required to complete a Primary Teacher Education course if they want to keep their jobs. They risk dismissal if

they don't. Some states, like Chhattisgarh, have already fired their educators. But now that the new courses are available, there's a renewed chance that some of them will be rehired if they complete the necessary training.

### IT-Delhi rose 255 places to 171st globally

**Divya Delhi:** Among Indian universities for sustainability, IIT-Delhi rose 255 places to 171st globally, according to 2025 QS Rankings released. The QS Sustainability Rankings include 78 Indian universities, with nine of the top 10 improving and 21 new institutions entering. Two IITs—Delhi and Kanpur—are in the world's top 100 for impact. With 177 and 67 rank improvements, each became fourth and fifth in India. Bangalore's IISc is among the world's top 50 environmental education schools.

## A curriculum tailored to UAE business needs will be implemented at IIM-A

#### Divya Delhi:

**Standardized** GMAT/GRE scores taken within the last five years will form the basis of a rigorous two-stage admissions procedure for the full-time, one-year MBA program at IIMA's Dubai campus. Dubai provides unrivalled access to global



markets, renowned professors, and an inclusive, accomplished student body. By establishing a second campus in the Dubai International Academic City (DIAC), IIM-A would be able to further enhance its services in India and position itself as a world leader in management education

through the free flow of ideas and information. There are advantages and disadvantages to going global. IIM-A will tailor its programs to the Middle Eastern managers' specific requirements. Case studies and research on UAE and regional organizations are the goals of the campus.

## For undergraduate admissions at Delhi University, CUET will remain, and passing scores on the board exams will be necessary

**Divya Delhi:** After passing the CUET UG 2025 exam, candidates who are interested in DU's undergraduate programs must complete the CUET DU CSAS 2025 application form. In the final week of May 2025, the CUET DU CSAS 2025 registration will be launched at ugadmissions.uod. by the admissions unit at DU. In order to be admitted to DU's undergraduate program, students must take the CUET UG 2025. Starting in the second week of August 2025 and continuing forward, the CUET UG DU cutoff 2025 will be released by DU based on CUET subjects, course criteria, and percentile earned. Candidates should make sure to



keep themselves informed about the essential dates for the CUET DU cut off 2025. Filling out the CUET UG application form 2025 requires candidates to meet the course standards set by CUET DU and to map their subjects correctly. Class XII board results, with the exception of passing scores, will not affect their admissions, even though CUET is

required for admissions. The Common University Entrance Test (CUET) in the same topics covered in class XII is required, according to a previous webinar on the undergraduate admissions procedure by Delhi University (DU). At the session, representatives from the DU admissions office answered questions from parents and students.

## Punjab invests Rs 2,000 crore to modernize education and empower students

**Divya Delhi:** Punjab Education Minister Harjot Singh Bains announced that the state government will host 'Sikhya Kranti' a 54-day education celebration to inaugurate Rs 2,000 crore in infrastructural developments in 12,000 government institutions. Bains stressed the government's commitment to empowering students in an equal and modern learning environment. "The massive infrastructure development program includes school construction and renovation and modern learning facilities. "This initiative shows the state government's commitment to quality education for all children," the minister said. Clean water, high-speed WiFi, separate restrooms for girls and boys, desks, chairs, and boundary walls are given in government



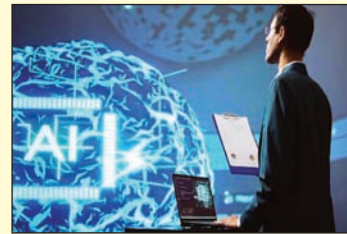
schools. Punjab was the first state to hire campus managers, security guards, and started student buses, according to Bains. More than 10,000 pupils use this facility. Over Rs 200 crore is spent annually on government school maintenance, the minister said. Bains said Cabinet Ministers and other dignitaries would inaugurate infrastructure development projects in over 350 government schools on the first day of "Sikhya Kranti".

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann and

Bains said 6,812 schools have new or renovated boundary walls covering nearly 1,000 miles, making learning safer. Life's Good. "The goal is to integrate AI and related courses into all academic programs so that students from all walks of life can learn the basics of AI and data analytics." The All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), which is the highest authority in India on technical education, has already updated the curriculum of various programs to include AI concepts. We have integrated artificial intelligence into electrical engineering and developed new BBA and BCA programs. The inclusion of data analytics and artificial intelligence into everyone's vocabulary is our aim, Sitharam said.

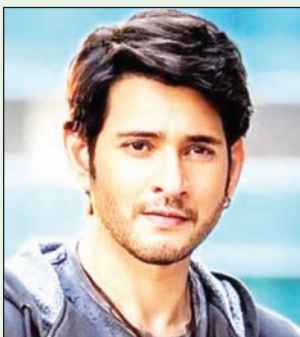

ous First Information Reports (FIRs) filed by the Telangana Police against them for allegedly deceiving investors by collecting advance payments for plots and then not honouring their agreements. Four places associated with the two organizations were searched by the agency on April 16, 2025. records of unreported financial transactions totaling almost 100 crore, as well as incriminating paperwork outlining the sums obtained through fraudulent activities, were seized during separate operations in the two locations.
